Last day before roadside spray!

Every year the Council periodically sprays to control vegetation on its road reserve areas, within water channels and side drains, parks, reserves and pavements.

This helps keep the District tidy and ensures drains are well maintained and free flowing.

Next week we will begin spraying our entire local roading network (excludes State Highways).

If you want us to avoid spraying the area outside your property, now's your last chance to let us know.

For a variety of reasons, people may not wish to have agri-chemicals sprayed outside their property. If this sounds like you, you can apply to have your property listed on the Council's "no-spray register" which means we will not spray directly outside your property.
