Water Restrictions for Hauraki

The current dry weather has raised demand on the District's water supplies. A cautious approach requires the introduction of Stage 1 water restrictions as from Monday 29th of November. A stage one restriction bans the use of sprinklers. Hand held hosing is allowed.

Prolonged warm, dry weather this early into summer means that everyone from farmers, urban residents, pool owners and holiday visitors will need to play their part in restricting the use of water. The Smart Water Use section of the Hauraki District Council website www.hauraki-dc.govt.nz has useful tips on how to conserve water.

Further restriction could be needed if the dry weather continues

WATER RESTRICTIONS

HAURAKI DISTRICT
from 29 November 2010

Notice to all residents of the Hauraki District (includes Netherpton, Kerepehi, Turua, Waitakaruru, Ngatea, Orongo, Kopuarahi, Pipiroa, Kaihere, Waihi, Paeroa, Mackaytown, Karangahake and Waikino)

Water Restrictions are now imposed district wide due to the current spell of dry weather which has led to a significant increase in water demand while water supply intakes are at a low level. It is advisable that water be conserved where possible.

Until further notice a restriction is placed on the use of lawn and garden sprinklers. Only hand held hosing will be permitted until the situation improves.

FURTHER SUBMISSIONS ON PROPOSED HAURAKI DISTRICT PLAN AND VARIATION NO. 1 TO THE PROPOSED HAURAKI DISTRICT PLAN (Clause 8 of Schedule 1, Resource Management Act 1991)

Hauraki District Council hereby gives notice that the Summary of Decisions requested by persons making submissions on the Proposed Hauraki District Plan and Proposed Variation No. 1 to the Proposed Hauraki District Plan has been prepared.

The Summary of Decisions, and the full submissions received by Council for both the Proposed District Plan and Variation No. 1, may be inspected at the Hauraki District Council offices at:

William Street, Paeroa
Orchard Road, Ngatea
Seddon Street, Waihi.

Any person described in clause 8 (1) may make a further submission on the submissions.

Clause 8 (1)

- any person representing a relevant aspect of the public interest; and
- any person that has an interest in the proposed plan greater than the interest that the general public has; and
- the local authority itself.

Those persons may make a further submission in support or in opposition to the relevant submission by sending a written submission addressed to:

The further submission must be in accordance with Form 6 and must state whether or not you wish to be heard on your further submission.

The further submission must be limited to a matter in support of or in opposition to the relevant submission you are making the further submission on.

You must send a copy of your further submission to the person whose submission you are supporting or opposing, within 5 working days of sending it to the Council.

Copies of the Further Submission Form 6 are available from the Hauraki District Council offices and website. Please note that there are separate Further Submission Forms for the Proposed Hauraki District Plan and for Variation No 1.

Further submissions close at 4pm on 15 December 2010.
