## NGATEA PLAN CHANGE

Council has applied to itself for a change in the District Plan to rezone areas of Ngatea as residential so that further residential subdivisions can be commenced. As it was applying to itself, Council commissioned two independent commissioners to hear the case and there were several submitters to the process including Environment Waikato and Transit NZ.

The commissioners have come up with a decision to allow the Plan change with a few minor changes. The process now allows for a period of 30 days where submitters can appeal the decision.

If there are no appeals and the change is finalised Council will proceed with the next stage of its subdivision along Benner Drive.

### CLOSURE OF ROAD TO ORDINARY VEHICULAR TRAFFIC
