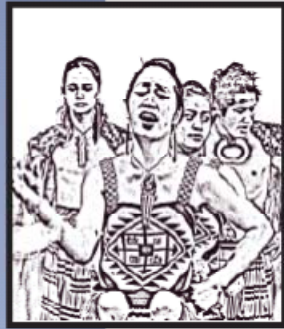

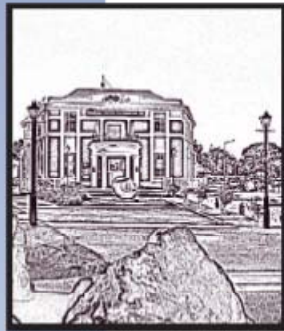

PRESENTATION: Paeroa Historical Museum – Heritage Walk (# 1594253)

Mr Lud Sparks of the Paeroa Historical Museum and Mr Graeme Wood of Paeroa Lions Club were in attendance to present on the proposal to establish a heritage trail within the Paeroa Ward. A report outlining the proposal was tabled.

Over the past 18 months the Paeroa Historical Society and the Paeroa Lions Club have been working towards establishing a heritage trail initially within the Paeroa Ward but with the long term plan that such a trail could be extended further through the District Council boundaries.

Possible sites have been identified within the CBD and a mock-up identification board has been produced. Prices have been sought to produce the signs.

The project is now at the stage where properties identified as having historical significance need to be contacted to ascertain if they would allow an A4 or A3 sign to be erected on their property. A list of historical sites/buildings was presented also for the member's information.

The Paeroa Lions have offered \$1,000 towards the initial cost of the project plus the labour to erect the signs and the Society has earmarked \$500.00 for the initial year.

The members provided feedback in support of the project. It was suggested that the group consider seeking funding support/sponsorship from other organisations including the Ward towards signage e.g. MacDonald sponsoring a sign outside their premises. It was also

suggested that the development of a mobile phone app could compliment this project as more information can be provided through this medium.

Waihi Walkways is assisting with the Primrose Hill Walkway project.

Positive Paeroa and the old Post Office Building Lighting

Positive Paeroa have requested permission to install 2 new LED lights into the gardens outside the old post office, (adjacent to the existing black lamp posts), facing the building.

Following a trial run with a temporary extension cord, it was considered that the lighting enhanced the building and Paeroa.

The installation has been offered free of charge by Adams Electrical, but the power will have to be connected up to the main lighting system, so there will be a nominal charge to Council for the additional power output.

The lights though are low wattage (5-10 watts) and use very little power and visually will be similar to the design of the ones currently at the war memorial site on Primrose Hill.

The organisation will present their quarterly report as soon as it is available.

Paeroa College Community Services Day

Staff have been contacted by teacher, Darren van de Wetering with regards to several year 11 students completing their social skills development programme and have asked if Council can help with ideas for projects around the town.

Previously, their projects have included painting and gardening. It is considered that the pensioner units could do with some assistance with their gardens. The Community Services – Facilities Manager is in discussion with each tenant to find out if they would like some free help in getting their gardens ready for spring.

Doggy Doo Bins – Appendix E (1585444)

The Parks and Reserves Manager included in his report, maps for each park/reserve/domain that is to receive new doggy doo bins and signage. The maps identify where each bin (indicated in red) and sign (indicated in blue) will be located.

After discussion it was agreed to amend the bins locations so that they would be placed within the exercise areas to avoid possible confusion of their location.

Staff recommended that the purchase and installation of the bins and signs be funded from the existing Animal Control Budget. The emptying of the doggy doo bins would be funded from the nearest Reserve's Budget.

The cost of each bin is \$430.00 and \$250.00 for each sign.

Paeroa Pool

Staff has received quotes for the concreting work for the southern side of the pool and currently await availability from the contractors to begin work.

Staff has had a meeting set with the schools to discuss the upcoming time table for the pool season. The opening date for the Ngatea pool is 19th November 2016 and a tentative closing date of Sunday the 19th March 2017.

The recruitment process for the lifeguard positions has commenced.

Tarariki Stream Trees Removal

More trees have been removed for firewood despite the installation of a new lock and signage advising that removal of trees is not permitted. The chain has been cut and the firewood thieves have installed their own lock to allow themselves easy access through the gate. It has been decided that the solution is now to remove the existing lock and install a stainless steel chain which cannot be cut.

Hutchinson Reserve

Hutchinson Reserve has been visited by Councils Roding Engineer and it has been determined that there is no problems with the installation of a new fence as long as the work is conducted with the appropriate consideration given to safety, traffic management and drainage. Staff are still waiting for quotes for the fencing work. An outside party is assisting with the funding application towards the fencing costs.

Signage for Marshall Street Motor Home Parking Area

Paeroa Police have made a request that signage be installed at the Marshall Street Motor Home parking area that warns of the possibility of theft of unsecured items. This comes in the wake of a spate of thefts from this area. Staff are progressing with this request. The asphalt surface of the parking area is also being repaired.

Donated Gingko Trees

The locations for planting of Gingko trees was decided in consultation with the supplier and have been planted in Railway Reserve in the first week of September. They are planted in such a layout to provide an avenue effect as they mature. It was suggested that Gingko trees also be planted behind the campervan parking area as this area had been earmarked for new planting earlier in the year but had not been actioned.

Street Sweeping

A programme of twice weekly street sweeping has begun in the Paeroa central business area. This is to be conducted on Monday and Thursday mornings starting at approximately 6.30am. A wash of the central business area is planned to be undertaken in September.

GENERAL

Christmas Lights

Staff have begun preparations and costings for the installation of Christmas lights for the trees in the main street and would like the Ward Committee to consider that some permanent lighting be installed for year round decoration. Staff are suggesting that the \$15,000 budget for additional lights can be split between new lights and converting last year's light to a permanent display.

Recommendation

Staff are suggesting that the \$15,000 budget for additional lights can be split between new lights and converting last year's light to a permanent display.

Cycle Racks – Appendix A (1594873)

The Ward Committee have asked staff to investigation a new form of bike rack for Paeroa, as the current ones are having the issues of being difficult to see and not flexible enough for the range and size on bikes being currently used.

The Parks and Reserves Manager has researched the market and is recommending the Spyra rack.

The Spyra rack can accommodate 12 bikes when installed in a location that allows access from both sides, and up to six bikes when installed against a wall or building. The cost to purchase and install each rack is \$1,865.00 (excl GST). This price includes the cost of coloured powder-coating for each rack.

It is also proposed that over the next 12 months the Ward Committee, replace the existing cycle racks in the main street of Paeroa with Spyra Cycle Racks, and that the existing galvanised cycle racks be relocated to suitable areas on the Hauraki Rail Trail

Recommendation

THAT the Spyra Cycle rack be installed in Corbett St, outside the E Ronnie Cafe, and

THAT that the cost of the bike stand is contributed 50% from E Ronnies Cafe and 50% from the Paeroa Ward Community Facilities and Recreational Development Fund, and Hauraki District Council.

*Reference: **PROPOSAL FOR MOBILE CART TO SITUATE AT KARANGAHAKE RESERVE***

Description of the proposal and proposed location within the reserve:

- *Mobile Food Cart – Catering hot food and beverages and real fruit icecream.
Hot Food includes: Burgers, kebarbs, hot chips, hot dogs, bacon and egg rolls, steak rolls, pies,
Beverages inc: Real fruit icecream, cans of drinks, bottled water, ice blocks.*
- *Location for the potential concession I would like to take place is at the karangahake reserve.*

Description of the potential effects of the proposed activities and the methods to be employed to avoid, remedy or mitigate adverse effects on reserve users and/or neighbours:

- *Rubbish bins will be provided for the cart rubbish and dissposed of accordingly to limit any pests and rodents.*
- *The use of the generator will be housed in an enclosed area to reduce noise as much as possible.*
- *Two fire extinguiser's and a fire blanket will be stored on the food cart in case of an emergency.*
- *I will also take my own wastewater away.*
- *I will be holding a public liability insurance cover.*
- *In any cases I will hold cones for any incidents that occur to cordoned off any area for the public safety until the emergency services arrives if need be.*

Duration of the activity: Hours of the operation, days which the concession will function and period of the year over it will operate:

- *I want to run the operation every saturday and sunday as well as public holidays and school holidays.*
- *Hours would be from 10am till 4pm (estimation at this point.)*
- *Year period running of this operation would be from October till May each calendar year.*

The experience and resources of the concessionaire to successfully operate the concession:

- *I am a first time owner of a mobile food cart, in saying that I have a brother who owns his own mobile food cart and currently holds a concession for the southern parks in Auckland that I have on many times helped out on his location of his business, so I am very much aware how this operation works and have all the confidence that I will successfully be able to function my own mobile food cart very well and to the up most profession.*

Council's Reserve Management Plan

Council's Reserve Management Plan outlines the policy for Commercial Use and Concessions as follows with staff comments, in regards to this application, in italics.

COMMERCIAL USE AND CONCESSIONS

Policy

- a) The temporary or permanent private commercial use of public reserve will generally not be permitted.
- b) From time to time, however, Council may determine that a commercial activity is complementary to the purpose of a particular reserve, will assist in the public use and enjoyment of the reserve, is compatible with or will avoid or mitigate any potential adverse effects on neighbours and will not adversely affect the general character and amenity of the reserve. In such cases Council may determine that it is appropriate to provide for the activity by way of a concession. ***This activity will complement the users of the Reserve. There is potential disapproval of this activity from the neighbouring cafe. Due to pressure on the reserve for parking, this activity may reduce the number of available parking spots.***
- c) Commercial use of reserve will not be allowed unless a formal concession is granted for a particular activity involving a specific site and times during which the activity may take place.
- d) Commercial use (including private or commercial access over a reserve) that conflicts with and/or limits the public use and enjoyment of the reserve or affects its amenity will not be permitted. ***There would be minimal disruption to the users of the reserve.***

- e) Where access over a reserve and use of its facilities provides for a commercial activity, such as use of a public boat ramp by commercial fishing boats and/or tourist related activities, Council will require payment of appropriate charges by the commercial user to assist in the maintenance and enhancement of the facility.
- f) Any concession for use of a reserve will:
- Define and limit the area within which the activity is to be carried out,
 - Specify the times (over the year and during the day) during which the concession can operate,
 - Specify the nature of the activities the concession operator can provide,
 - Define the signage (if any) permitted in association with the concession, and
 - Specify the fee or bond amount.
- g) Concessions will not provide for the exclusive use of any part of a reserve and will not function to the disadvantage of general public use of the reserve.
- h) Any concession permitted by Council will be specific to the operator identified and will not be transferable.
- i) Any concession granted by Council will be for a specified period with no automatic rights of renewal.
- j) The following criteria will be used to assess any concession applications received:
- The extent to which the proposed activity is compatible with the designated purpose and use of the reserve
 - The extent to which the proposed activity will assist the public use and enjoyment of the reserve and not disadvantage other users
 - The compatibility of the proposed activity in relation to neighbouring properties and the ability for any adverse effects on neighbours to be avoided, remedied or mitigate
 - The extent to which the proposed activity will impinge on the physical attributes and spatial qualities of the reserve
 - The need for permanent structures that could detract from the character of the reserve when the concession is not in operation.
- k) Any application to operate commercial activities on a reserve should be made to the Manager Parks and Property, Hauraki District Council in writing and include information in relation to:
- A description of the proposal and its proposed location within the reserve
 - A description of the potential effects of the proposed activity and the methods to be employed to avoid, remedy or mitigate adverse effects on reserve users and/or neighbours (ie noise from generators)
 - The duration of the activity (hours of operation, days over which the concession will function and period of the year over which it will operate)
 - The experience and resources of the concessionaire to successfully operate the concession ***The application is attached***
- l) Council will charge a levy for the commercial use of reserves. A bond will also be required for any commercial activities for which concessions are granted. ***Council will still need to determine this as there is no set fee.***
- m) The applicant concessionaire will be responsible for ensuring that they fully comply with and receive any necessary consents in relation to the Resource Management, Building, Health and Safety in Employment Acts and other relevant Acts as well as the District Plan and comply with any relevant bylaws.

Explanation

Public reserves are for the use and enjoyment of the public. In general reserves provide respite from commercial facilities and provide opportunities for families, groups and individuals to pursue recreational activities away from commercial environments. From time to time, however, there will be temporary and/or permanent recreation-related commercial activities that are fully compatible with the purpose of the reserve and that can assist or enhance the use and enjoyment of the reserve for a significant number of reserve users. Council will consider applications for concessions on reserves and where appropriate provide for such activities as an adjunct to the reserve.

Recommendation

That the Ward Committee provide comments on an application from Gaylene Ranga to operate a mobile food cart to be situated at Karangahake Reserve.

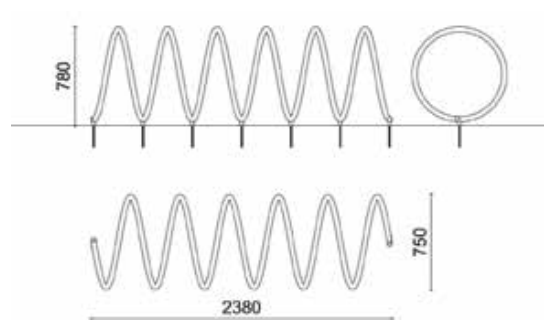
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
