# What is it?

The purpose of the awards is to recognise, encourage and reward New Zealand's most vital resource - its people. The awards seek out and promote the incredible achievements of individuals, organisations and community groups and create a sense of national pride, unity and inspiration through their example as mentors and role models to the wider community.

# When are they?

The New Zealander of the Year Awards, are presented at a gala presentation on the 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2011.

# Is there more than one award?

Yes, there are five award categories:

- Kiwibank New Zealander of the Year Award
- Countdown Senior New Zealander of the Year
- Coca-Cola Amatil Young New Zealander of the Year
- Mitre 10 New Zealand Community of the Year
- Kiwibank Local Heroes Awards

# Can you explain each award?

The Kiwibank New Zealander of the Year Award has no age restriction. The recipient will be selected for his or her major contribution to our nation, and that person will have demonstrated an unrivalled ability to inspire us all through both their achievements and their outstanding service to the country and its people.

The Countdown Senior New Zealander of the Year Award will be open to those aged 60 and over, and will celebrate an ability to continue to achieve and to contribute to our nation.

The Coca-Cola Amatil Young New Zealander of the Year Award recognises the most outstanding and exceptional New Zealander aged between 15 and 30. The award highlights the valuable and necessary contribution of our youth and celebrates extraordinary achievement and leadership.

The Mitre 10 New Zealand Community of the Year acknowledges groups and organisations working together to build better communities and examples of teamwork, enthusiasm, dedication and cooperation in the planning and implementation of an activities that lead to a positive and sustained benefit for all.

The Kiwibank Local Heroes Awards are presented across New Zealand in conjunction with local communities and recognise the efforts of New Zealanders who are making positive contributions to their regions day in and day out. Up to 10 Local Heroes medals will be awarded in each of 25 regions across the country.

# How do people enter?

Nominations open on August 3rd and can be completed online at <a href="https://www.nzawards.org.nz">www.nzawards.org.nz</a> or nomination forms can be collected from any participating Kiwibank, Countdown or Mitre 10 store nationwide. Nomination forms can also be requested toll free on 0508 692 927. A concerted effort will be made to contact community groups and organisations across the country to make it possible for any New Zealander to nominate. Entry is free but all nominees must be New Zealand citizens and must have resided in New Zealand for a period of no less than two years.

Nominations close on October 22nd, with finalists announced in mid December. 2010.

#### Who should be nominated?

These awards call for as many nominations as possible – the New Zealander of the Year Awards is about celebrating the very best of New Zealand, regardless of ethnicity, interest, gender or inclination. Anyone who has made an outstanding contribution to any group, organization, community should be considered a potential nominee – especially those that have already been awarded by their respective organizations.

#### How are the winners chosen?

Nominations close on October 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2010 at which point an executive judging panel will be convened. They will oversee the judging process with assistance from category judging groups. It is envisaged that these panels will comprise well-known New Zealanders and experts across each of the categories, as well as representatives from the Awards Patrons. Announcements of the judging panel will be made in October.

The New Zealand of the Year Awards 2010 judges included:

# How many winners will there be?

There will be one national winner, selected from three finalists, for each of the major awards. There will be up to 10 Local Heroes winners in each of the 25 selected regions. From these regional winners 3 will be chosen as finalists for the national Local Hero Award.

#### What do the winners receive?

Winners of the major awards will each receive a \$5,000 grant from Kiwibank, a specially crafted trophy, and a framed certificate commemorating their achievements. All finalists and nominees each receive a certificate commemorating their achievements.

Local Heroes Award winners each receive a medal and a certificate commemorating their achievements.

# What do these awards hope to achieve?

Simply put, these awards are about celebrating the best of us. We want all New Zealanders to feel a sense of pride at some of the extraordinary contributions people just like them make every day. If they know about it, it just may inspire others to reach for greater heights!

# So, this isn't just about famous people then?

Absolutely not! We would hope some well-known New Zealanders are nominated but ultimately you don't have to be broadly recognised to have made a contribution to your country or your community. These awards are for everyone, at all levels and the judging will reflect that.

# A very high profile New Zealander is Patron of the Awards, we understand.

Indeed! Former Prime Minister, The Rt Hon Jim Bolger ONZ, is the official Patron of the New Zealander of the Year Awards.

# The New Zealander of the Year Awards in Brief:

- The New Zealander of the Year Awards will recognise, acknowledge and reward the individuals and community groups that demonstrate the greatest contribution to New Zealand and New Zealanders.
- The New Zealander of the Year Awards will be presented at an Awards Gala
   Presentation on 2<sup>nd</sup> February, 2011.
- Awards will be presented to The New Zealander of the Year, Senior New Zealander of the Year, Young New Zealander of the Year, Community of the Year and the national Local Hero Award.
- There will also be Local Heroes Awards presented in 25 regions throughout the country. From these winners 3 nominees will be selected for the national Local Heroes Award judging.
- Nominations are open from August 3rd, 2010 and will close on October 22nd, 2010.
- Nominees must be New Zealand citizens and must have been resident in New Zealand for no less than 2 years.
- Nominees be at least 15 years of age as of 6<sup>th</sup> February, 2011, to be considered for an award

# Who won in 2010?

New Zealander of the Year 2010 was Ray Avery of Auckland, 63, who is a former street kid turned scientist whose low cost, sustainable medical devices - invented in the garage of his Mount Eden home - are making a difference to millions of the world's most vulnerable and poor.

**Sir Eion Edgar of Otago**, named *Senior New Zealander of the Year* for his lifetime of philanthropic service.

Divya Dhar, 24 of Manukau, named Young New Zealander of the Year for campaigning against global poverty and climate change.

Haami (Sam) Tutu Chapman of Manukau, given the Local Heroes Award for his extraordinary work with gangs and communities at risk.

Victory Village in Nelson, given the Community of the Year Award for creating strong support services for happy and successful communities.
