Purpose

This report is to inform the Ward on community development activities.

Requests for Financial Assistance [CDV-30-100]

The Waihi Ward Committee has an allocation of \$8,218.00 for discretionary grants during this 2012/13 financial year. Grants have been made to the following:

There are two requests for financial assistance this month.

Waihi Arts Centre & Museum Inc [911713]

The Office Manager on behalf of the committee for the society requests that the Ward consider installing strip lighting on the museum building in keeping with what is going onto various lamp standards in Seddon Street.

The writer advises that the society will be celebrating its 50th anniversary in November this year; the building will be 100 years old in 2013.

The writer has also provided a plan for where the lights are to go with the preferred colour being gold.

The lights are estimated to cost \$650.

Whiritoa Lifeguard Service [939386]

The secretary for the club writes advising that they are redeveloping their clubhouse that will require a building consent. The fee for four compliance inspections is estimated to be \$2245.00; the writer seeks assistance with this cost.

The development will include the installation of shade cloths and modification of the interior of the clubhouse.

Awards – Citizens and Young Achievers 2012 [CDV-30-200 & 300]

Nominations for the Citizens and Young Achievers Awards 2012 closed with a total of 16 and 12 respectively assessed by the committees earlier this month.

The Citizens Award committee selected 8 of the nominees for Service to the Community and 2 for Outstanding Service to the Community.

The Young Achievers committee received 11 nominations from the district colleges and 1 from an organisation within the district.

The event will be held in the Paeroa War Memorial Hall on Tuesday 9 October 2012 starting at 7:00pm.

The format for this event will be the same last year.
