



Local lizards delay rail trail build

Local lizards are stalling the start of work on the final stretch of the Hauraki Rail Trail.



Construction of the 10km home straight between Pūkorokoro-Miranda and Kaiaua township, has been delayed while a Lizard Management Plan is finalised with the Department of Conservation.

The plan will ensure the trail doesn't disturb the local lizard population.

It's expected the plan will get the green light soon and work will start before the end of November.

Slip removal on East Coast Road

We're been advised by the Auckland Transport road maintenance contractor that work to clear a slip on East Coast Road, Orere Point, is planned to start on 4 November. The work is expected to take about one week. Traffic will be allowed through in between loading trucks, but motorists should expect delays.
