Following the Prime Minister's announcement this week, our number one priority is the wellbeing of our communities and staff.

What this means for you

Until further notice:

- Our Council offices in Waihi and Ngatea are closed.
- Our main office in Paeroa will remain open for emergency access only, for example if you have no water and no other means to contact us.
- Our libraries and other community facilities, such as pools and halls are closed.
- Our playgrounds are closed, however you're still allowed to go out, on your own, for fresh air and exercise.
- We will not be carrying out any building inspections.
- The Hauraki Rail Trail is closed.

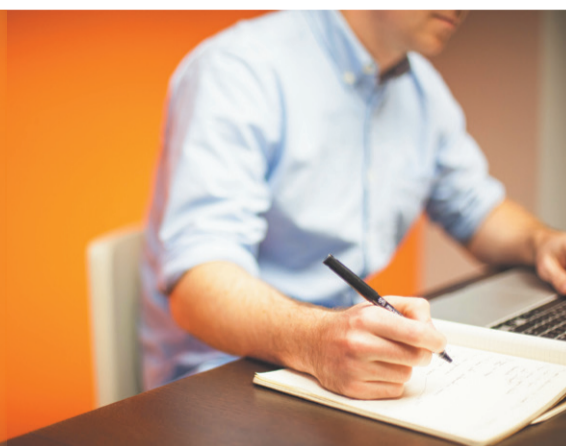

Anzac Day

The Returned and Services Association (RSA) has cancelled all public Anzac Day events. Taking this into consideration, and the restrictions in place in response to COVID-19, Anzac Day civic services at Ngatea War Memorial Hall, Paeroa War Memorial Hall and Waihi Memorial Hall have also been cancelled. The unveiling of the Memorial Wall at Ngatea, planned for 25 April, has been postponed, with the new date still to be decided.

"It's an absolute shame that we can't honour these men and women in the way we've honoured them in the past, but that doesn't mean we can't acknowledge them in other ways," said Mayor Toby Adams.

"Please use the day to remember, in your own way, those who have served and are still serving our country in conflicts and peacekeeping."
