

Ngatea town centre footpath takes shape

Work on upgrading the footpath in Ngatea township is now well underway. When it's not raining, crews are pouring their way steadily up the main street.

Mayor Toby Adams says it's great to see work progressing and even better to see good old Hauraki hospitality being extended to Council's contractor Schick Civil Construction.

"They've asked us to pass on their thanks to the Ngatea community for being so friendly and helpful. They've been made to feel very welcome in the town," he said.

While people are welcome to come and have a look at the work being done, it's important to remember crews are working on a construction site.

"It's important for your own safety to stay behind the barriers and follow the instructions of the teams on site," the Mayor said.

Despite a two week delay in the project start date while the contractor waited for its traffic management plan to be approved, every effort is being made to meet the original estimate of ten weeks to complete the work. However, this may now be a bit ambitious, particularly if crews encounter any other unexpected issues along the way.

"Having said that, we're doing everything we can to progress this project and we hope things go smoothly from here," the Mayor said.
