### Change to collection dates - Labour Day

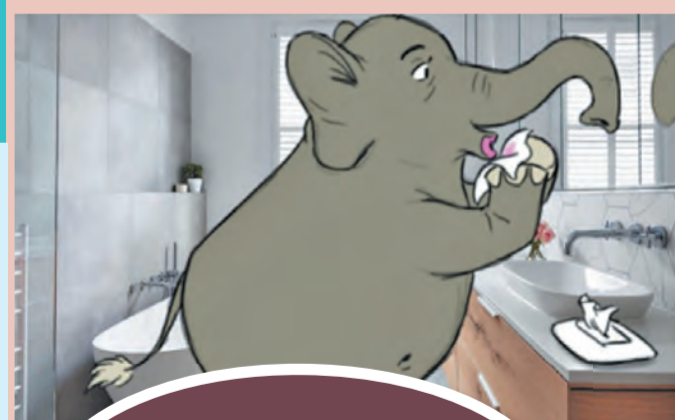
Due to Monday 28 October being a public holiday, kerbside collections in the Hauraki District for the week of 28 October to 1 November will be carried out a day later than normal. The schedule below shows the collections in your area. Remember to have your items on the kerbside by 7.30am.

Location	Date	Items for collection
Whiritoa	Tuesday 29 October	Refuse bags only
Ngatea, Kaiaua and Waitakaruru	Thursday 31 October	Refuse bags and recycling
Kerepehi and Turua	Thursday 31 October	Refuse bags only
Waihi and Waikino	Friday 1 November	Refuse bags only
Karangahake, Mackaytown and Paeroa	Friday 1 November	Refuse bags and recycling
