Subject to the following conditions:

CONDITIONS

- 1 Subject to the conditions of this consent, the consent holder shall undertake the activity in general accordance with the information contained in the document "Paeroa Water Supply Lower Waitawheta Intake – Assessment of Environmental Effects – Hauraki District Council" (Opus International Consultants Limited, 16 November, 1998) and the letter from Opus International Consultants Limited to Environment Waikato, dated 28 January 1999 and titled "Paeroa Water Supply Take: Application for Resource Consent to Take".
- 2 The consent holder shall be responsible for all sub-contracted operations related to the exercise of this resource consent, and must ensure sub-contractors are made aware of the conditions of this resource consent and ensure compliance with those conditions.
- 3 The consent holder shall ensure that no historical/archaeological structures are altered as a result of the activities authorised by this consent.
- 4 The consent holder shall undertake to consult with the Hauraki Maori Trust Board and Te Ruunanga a Iwi o Ngati Tamatera with the aim of establishing protocols with regards whakanoa (tikanga), discovery of artefacts, and monitoring of the construction activity.
- 5 The consent holder shall produce a report, in consultation with representatives of the Fish and Game Council and the Department of Conservation, that details how construction activities, in particular blasting, will be carried out to minimise effects on fish life. This report will be to the satisfaction of the Waikato Regional Council, and a copy will be provided to the Waikato Regional Council at least four weeks before construction is to begin.
- 6 Construction activities shall be carried out in accordance with the report described in condition 5 of this consent.
- 7 The consent holder shall inform the Waikato Regional Council in writing, at least one week prior to any work commencing, of the start date of the works authorised by this resource consent.
- 8 All surplus fill and excavated material shall be disposed of at the expense of the consent holder to the satisfaction of the Waikato Regional Council.
- 9 The consent holder shall ensure that sediment losses to natural water arising from the exercise of this resource consent are minimised during the construction works and during the term of this consent. All in-river sediment and rock that is to be moved during construction, is to be picked up and deposited in a way that minimises sediment disturbance.
- 10 The consent holder shall ensure that as far as practicable, cementing and grouting works are isolated from the river flow, such that loss of cement/grout material to the river is minimised.
- 11 In-river trenches shall be finished in such a way that normal rock cover will re-establish over the finished trench. Trenches not covered by river water shall be finished to blend as far as practicable, with the surrounding ground conditions.
- 12 All machinery shall be operated in a manner which ensures that spillages of fuel, oil and similar contaminants are prevented, particularly during refuelling and machinery servicing and maintenance. Refuelling and lubrication activities shall be carried out away from any water body such that any spillage can be contained so it does not enter the Ohinemuri or Waitawheta Rivers. All machinery working near and in the rivers shall be clean and well maintained, with particular care taken to maintain hydraulic and fuel lines and seals. **Materials necessary for remedial actions in the event of a spill shall be kept on the work site so they are readily available for use.** In the event of a spill of fuel, oil or similar contaminant, where such contaminant enters the waterway, the consent holder shall immediately contact the Waikato Regional Council.

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- 13 In the event that any archaeological remains are discovered, the works shall cease immediately and Tangata Whenua and the Waikato Regional Council shall be notified within 48 hours. Works may recommence with the written approval of the Waikato Regional Council. Such approval shall be given after the Waikato Regional Council has considered:
- (i) Tangata Whenua interests and values,
 - (ii) the consent holders interests, and
 - (iii) any archaeological or scientific evidence.
- 14 There shall be no earthworks on the stream banks nor any disturbance of the stream bed associated with maintenance or monitoring of the water take or associated structures without prior written approval from the Waikato Regional Council. This approval shall be obtained at least two weeks prior to the works being undertaken.
- 15 The consent holder shall pay to the Waikato Regional Council any administrative charge fixed in accordance with section 36 of the Resource Management Act 1991, or any charge prescribed in accordance with regulations made under section 360 of the Resource Management Act.
