



Extent of HAU450 & HAU451



HAU 450 is defined by vertical as well as horizontal limits, as follows:

In relation to the Ohinemuri River HAU 450 covers the area between the true right bank of the River and a line 40 metres south of the track along the River, between Crown Hill Road and the Waitawheta River. In relation to the Waitawheta River HAU 450 covers the area 40 metres either side of the centre line of the River, upstream to the eastern boundary of the Department of Conservation land along the true left bank of the River, and thereafter the area 40 metres to the south of the centre line of the River, to the southern boundary of HAU 451, with vertical limits of 30 metres above the River bed and 10 metres below the River bed. Except that HAU 450 covers the full extent of archaeological site T13/286 – Talisman Battery.

HAU 451 covers the balance of the area shown as the Karangahake Gorge Historic Area on the planning maps.

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
