**Physical Description:** The Waikino School of Mines is a Victorian era gabled timber building with a pitched corrugated iron roof with roof ventilators, a rear salt box style lean to and a small entrance porch on the front gable with a pitched roof. An original 12-pane sash window is located on the front entrance, but the remaining windows have been boarded up. There are corrugated iron repairs to parts of the timber cladding. The building is in good condition, waterproof and sound.

**History:** Built as a branch school associated with the Karangahake School of Mines, it was one of the schools set up by W.J.M Larnach MHR, for Otago and Minister for Mines in Robert Stouts Government of 1906. The object of such schools was to encourage better managers and miners in the technology of extracting minerals.

When it opened in 1907, it was intended to be used mainly for the study of assaying, chemistry, mathematics and metallurgy, especially with a view to training students for the battery superintendent's examination. An additional room was added in 1910 to serve as a laboratory for assaying.
