**History:** Earnest Alexander McLeay came to Waihi in 1892 to make boots for the miners and in doing so founded McLeay's which is the oldest surviving business in Waihi. In 1918 he purchased McLeay's current building from Hallenstein Brothers and ran the store until 1936. His son Pat took over the family's store until 1988. The store is operated by Pat's son-in-law and daughter, Ian and Heather Robinson.
