History: The first public hall was built on a site on Hauraki Road adjacent to the River. It was blown off its foundation by a gale in 1910. Stopbanks for the Waihou and Ohinemuri Rivers Improvement Schemes needed the hall site, so it was moved on in 1922 to its present site. It is still in use today.
