Notable features: The left column bears a plaque memorializing those servicemen from Hikutaia that died in the First World War and the right column lists the names of all the local servicemen that served in that war.

Style: Monumental

Materials: Wrought iron, plaster, granite

Date of Construction: 1923 - 1926

History: William Henry Alley donated the land for a park in honor of Hikutaia servicemen that served in the First World War. Three of W H Alley's cousins (Alfred and David, who were brothers, and Fredrick) were among those that died in service to NZ. Local volunteer labour turned the paddock into a memorial
